What is a By-Name List of Homeless Individuals?



A real-time list of people experiencing homelessness



Inflow and outflow mechanisms



Connect people to services and supports they need



Why a By-Name List for the District of Thunder Bay?

2022

The Ontario Service Manager By-Name List 2022 (BNL 2022) Guidelines

Service Managers expected to begin developing By-Name Lists April 2021, and meet minimum Ministry requirements by December 31, 2021, and the By-Name List had to be operational by April 1, 2023.

Objectives of the By-Name List

Understand characteristics of homelessness and pathways into and out of homelessness

Connect people experiencing homelessness to services and supports

Addressing barriers for Indigenous communities and higher risk populations (due to discrimination and marginalization)



By-Name List Inflow

Inflow to the By-Name List by sharing information through an intake process.

By-Name List Outflow

Through the By-Name list it is possible to know if an individual has left homelessness for housing. Outflow can include:

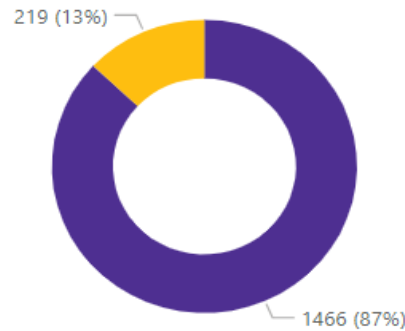

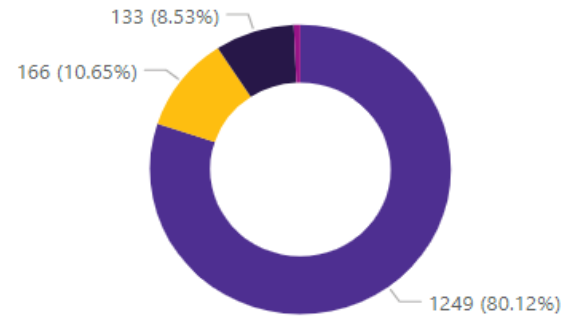

Active Clients on the By-Name List by Chronic Homelessness Status



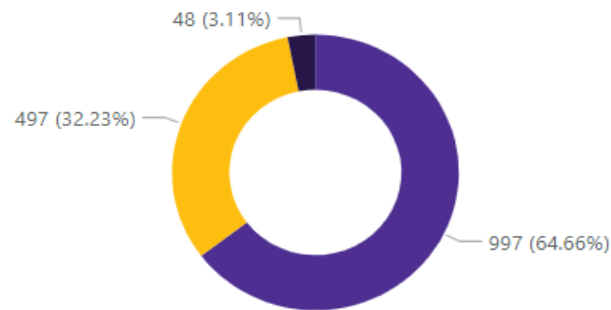
● Not Experiencing Chronic Homelessness ● Experiencing Chronic Homelessness

Active Clients on the By-Name List by Age Ranges



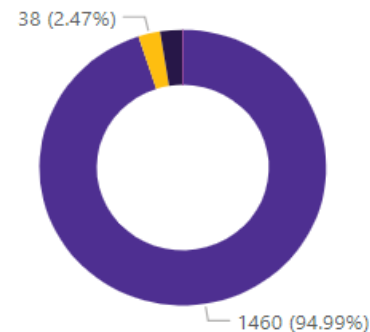

Active Clients on the By-Name List by Veteran Status

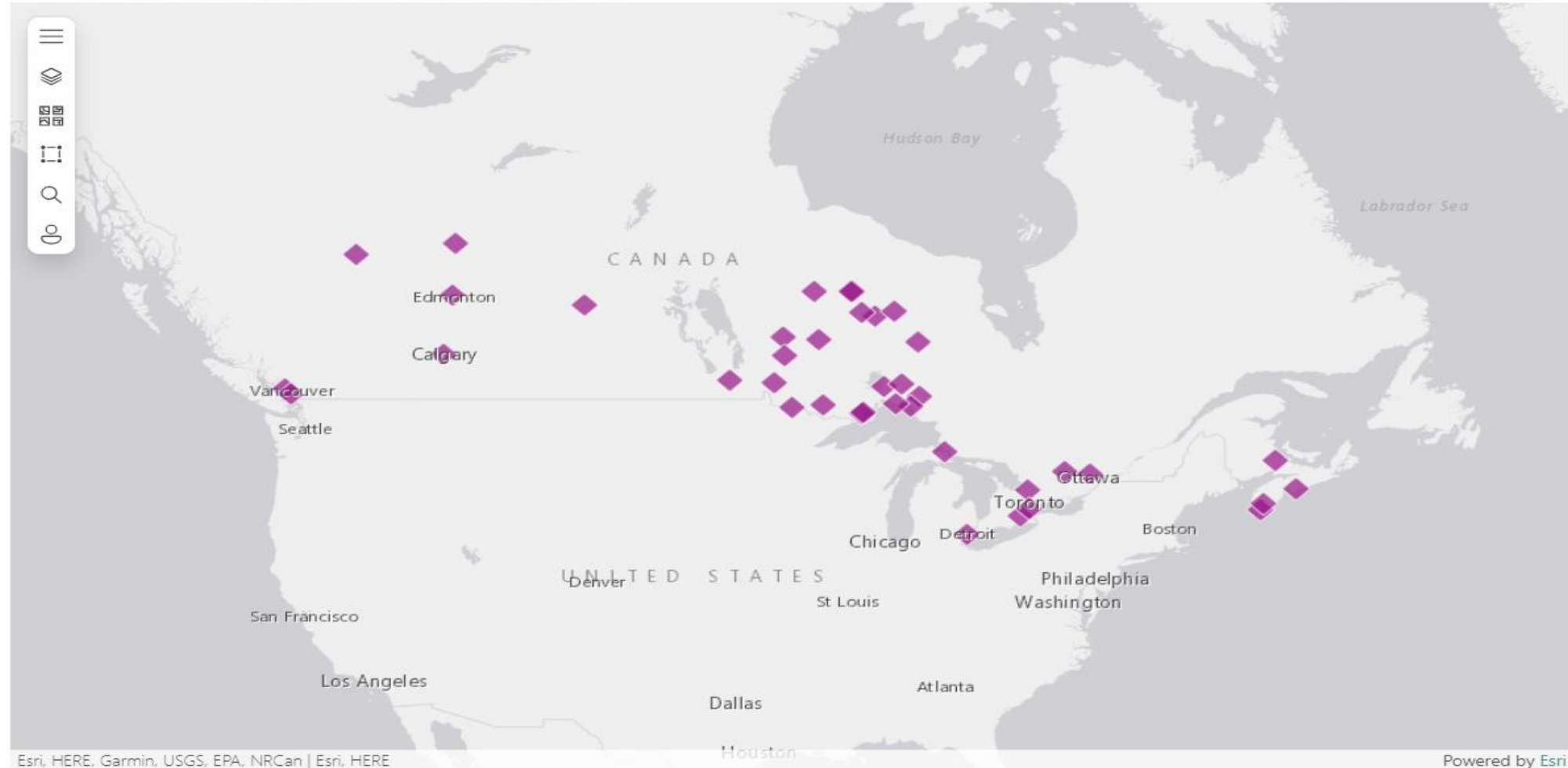

Home For Good and Coordinated Housing Access Table



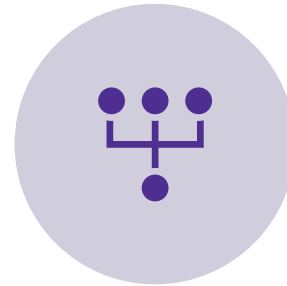
Home for Good (HFG) partnership with Dilico and St. Joseph's Care Group



Provision of intensive case management and portable benefit



Coordinated Housing Access Table (CHAT) is a partnership between 13 housing and support service organizations



Coordinated access moves towards an integrated system approach with common decision-making, rather than a collection of service providers making individual decisions



By-Name List – Future Plans

- Expand HFG program to include further supports and transitional housing units that have already been created, are currently under construction and those that will continue to be developed through HPP funding.
