Child Care & Early Years

TBDSSAB manages the child care and early years system in the District of Thunder Bay. Our Child Care & Early Years Programs help families by managing the child care wait list and offering child care fee subsidies to offset the costs of child care. We also provide operational funding and resources to Child Care operators and EarlyON programs throughout the District of Thunder Bay.

System Overview

As service system manager, TBDSSAB values the importance of investing in the physical, social, emotional, and economic health of our communities by supporting child care and early years programs that are accessible, affordable, inclusive, responsive and of high quality. TBDSSAB manages the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Program, which funds licensed spaces creating affordable child care for families.

- Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Program (CWELCC)
- Professional Learning for Educators

Workforce Impacts

Our child care service system needs 130 more educators to fill existing spaces. Hundreds more will be needed to support the families on the wait list.

TBDSSAB has partnered with Confederation College to invest in the next generation of Early Childhood Educators (ECEs). Through this partnership, students can access:

- 1. Free Pre-ECE certificate
- 2. ECE Program Bursaries
- Fast Track ECE Program to support those working in the field with prior learning and work experience on their path to become a registered ECE.
